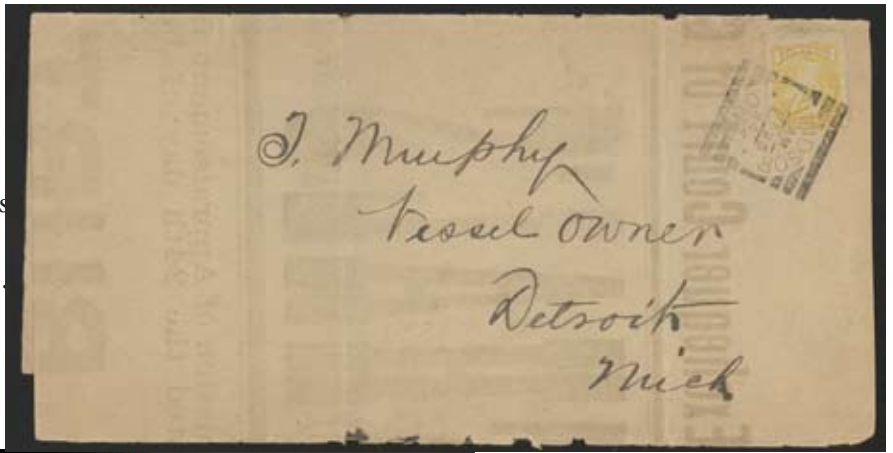

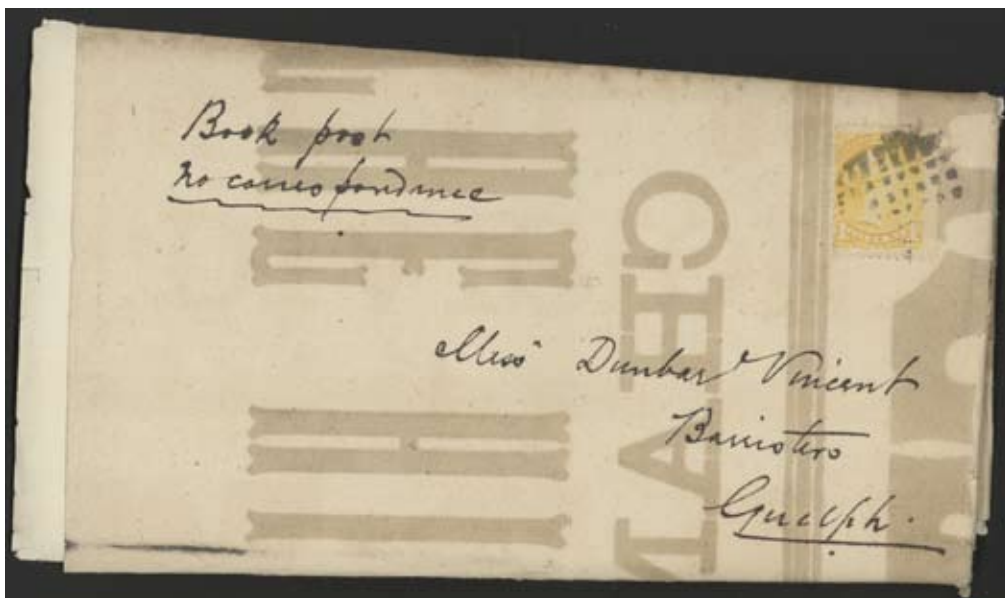

#35 1¢ SQ tied by Windsor, Ont squared circle (AM FE 26 94) to Detroit (2 backstamps) on large broadside (16 x 12" advertising sale of steam barge "IDA BURTON".(separation along a few folds, some small loss). Especially interesting to the ephemera and historical collectors because it is a dated piece and the printer (Review Press) is identified. Suitable for framing \$250

Image is distorted because it is comprised of several scans pasted together. Image reduced. Size is 16" x 12".

#35 1¢ SQ tied by cork cancel on large folded broadside (20" x 26") from Guelph to local address, ms "Book post no correspondence". There is a printed form letter attached from the High Court of Justice, at the top left of the broadside which is folded behind in order to scan (hence the apparent missing top left corner. It is intact).

Dated Nov 18 1882 at Guelph and noted as being printed by "Herald Press".

A huge broadside relating to the auction sale of a farm property in the Township of Luther.

A rarity to have survived. Suitable for framing.

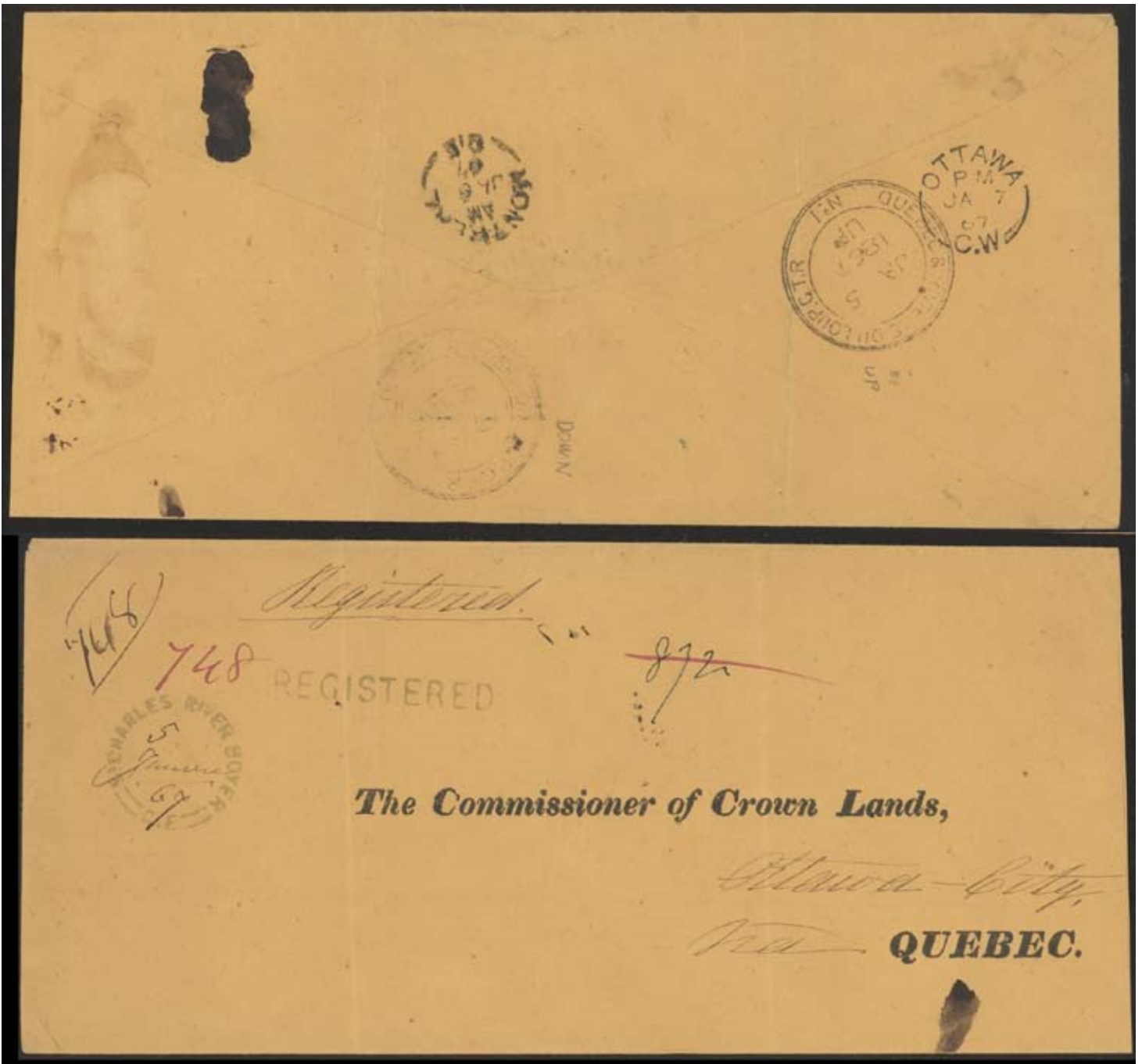

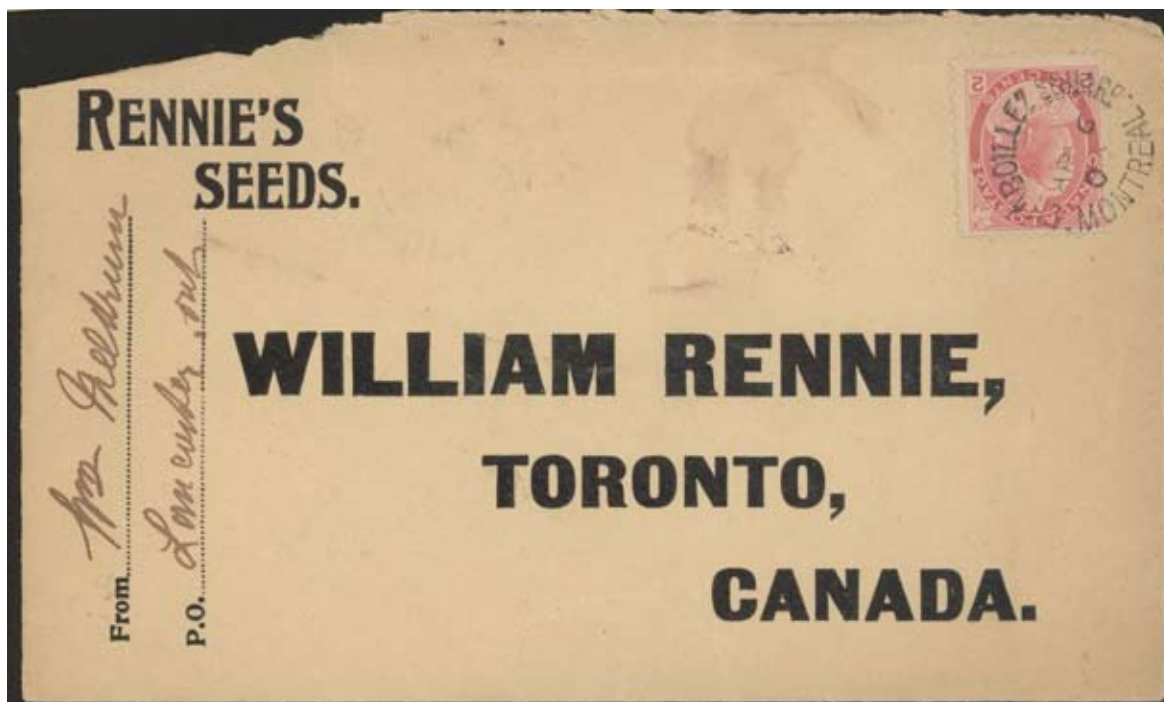

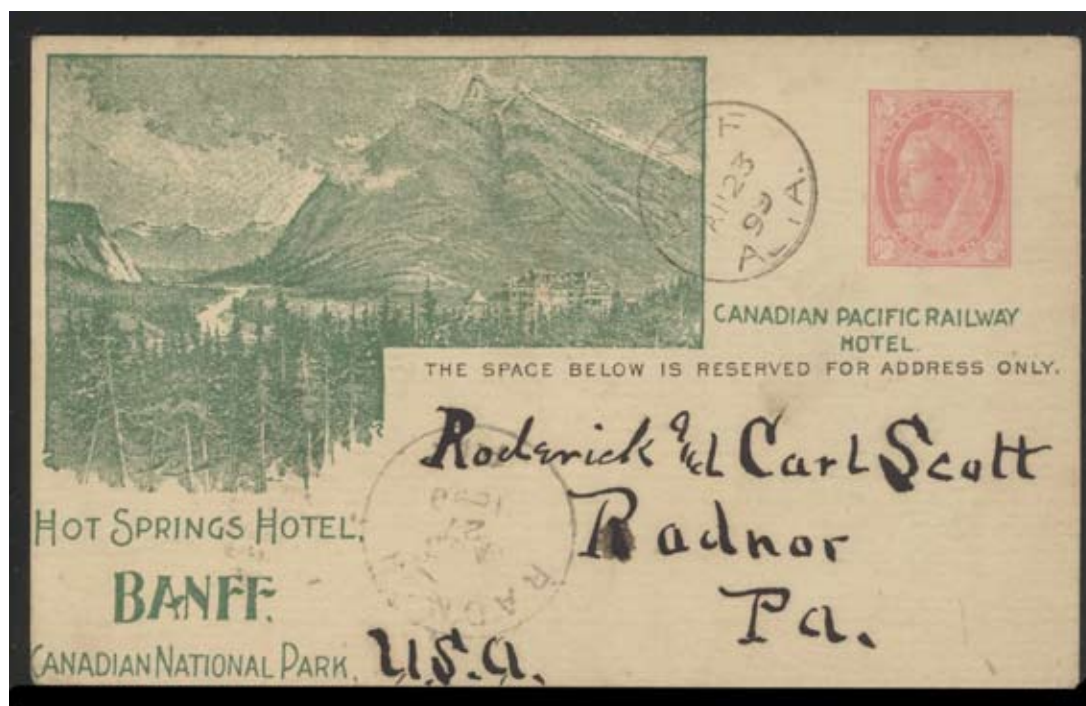

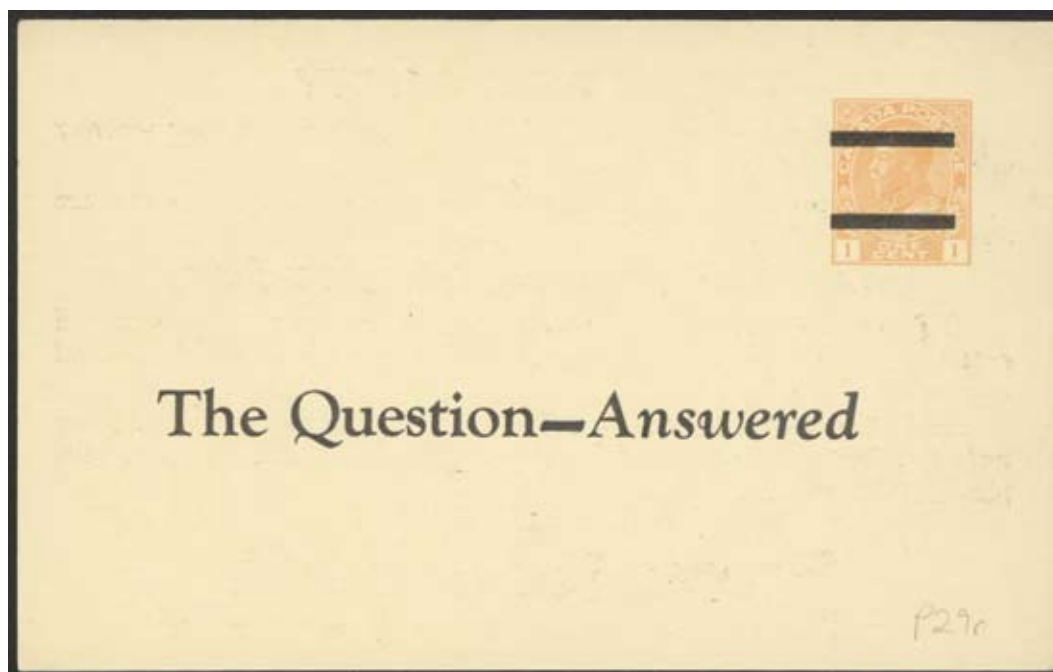

Page 8 top -- 1¢ Edward tied by grid hs on postcard from River John, NS (SP 12 08) to Tatamagouche. The postcard is a “glitter” card with mica attached. Mica caused damaged to the postal machinery as well as scratching the postal workers hands while emptying letter bags. This glitter card was mailed in a glassine envelope and the postmark ties through the hole cut out by the enterprising sender. The postmark in on the outside of the glassine. The 1906 official postal guide (sec 25) prohibits postcards in transparent envelopes but this is not noted in the 1908 guide (the year this postcard was mailed). Glitter cards were eventually prohibited. An excellent ite for the postcard, Edwardian or rules and regulation exhibitor. \$75

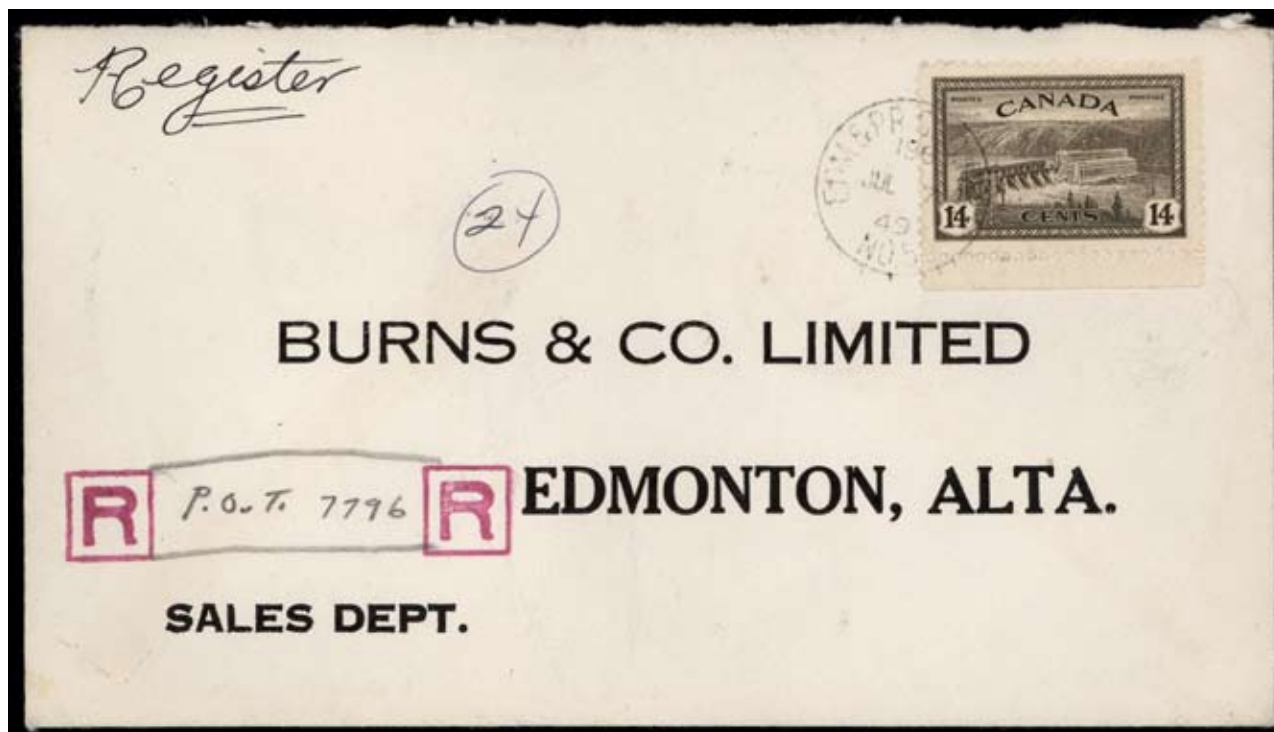

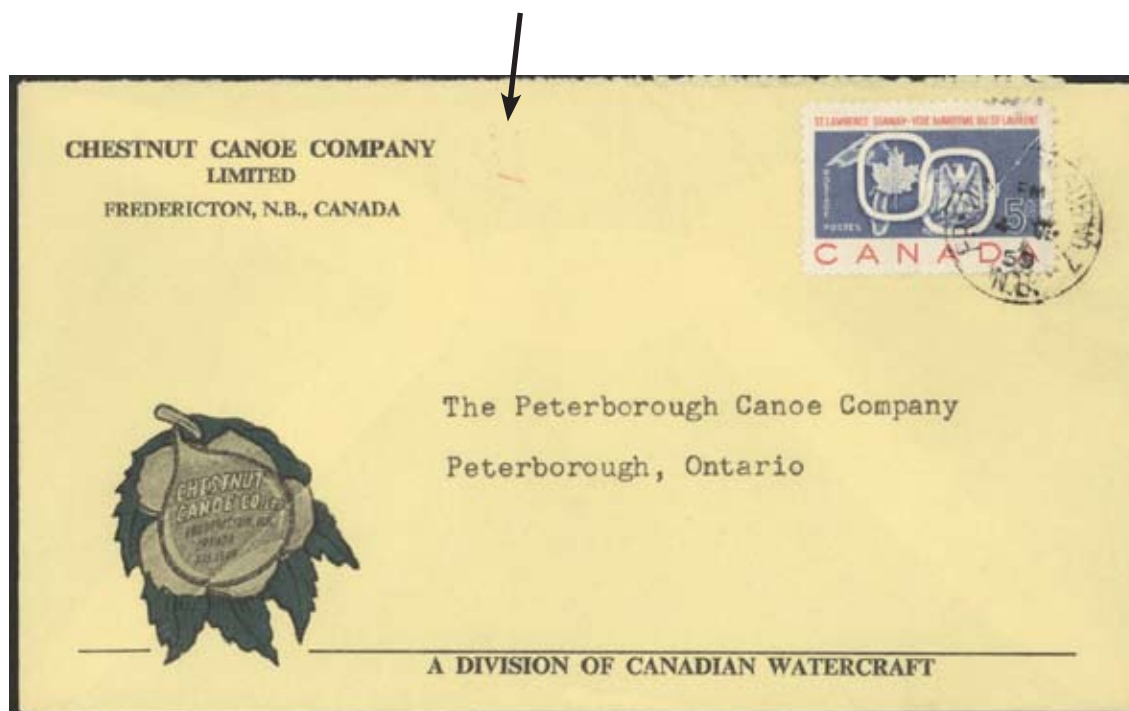
